Worldwide Grassroots Movement Could Handle the Drug Problem!

The problems of drug abuse and addiction are so widespread and devastating all over the world that community groups and concerned individuals are desperate for something that will produce results. Calls have come from many parts of the world, and Narconon International has tried to answer every call. This has taken President Clark Carr and other Narconon International staff members far and wide in recent months.

CHINA GETS A LOOK AT NARCONON TECHNOLOGY

The First China International Symposium on Alcohol and Health was put on by the Beijing SIJI Exchange Center for Science and Technology, the World Health Organization-Shanghai Collaborating Center for Health Education and Promotion, and the University of Nebraska. More than fifty delegates attended from throughout China, Australia, Canada, Europe, and Taiwan. The Narconon International President delivered an address on sauna sweat-out detoxification methodology, as developed by L. Ron Hubbard, in relation to treating alcoholism. He presented the research and published materials of the Narconon program and evidence of its worldwide delivery.

Following the symposium, the President met with Prof Gan Xingfa of the WHO-Shanghai Collaborating Center, who requested that someone from Narconon International come as soon as possible to present the Narconon drug rehabilitation method, to help pilot the Narconon program in a local hospital, and to help survey the China Republic regarding drug abuse. Many professionals in the country are aware that there is a large and growing problem and are searching for intelligent technology that can be implemented rapidly and locally to deal with it.

PROJECT BRIDGES – WASHINGTON, D.C.

An invitation to introduce Narconon technology and First Step Workshop at the second Project Bridges Faith Based Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Conference soon followed from Washington, D. C. The motto of the conference was “Mobilizing to Bridge the Gap.” It was about how to provide assistance to drug addicts and released inmates so they can “re-enter” society and live ethical and productive lives free of drugs.

The conference focus was on faith- and community-based organizations, building them into a grassroots movement toward handling the drug problem.

The attendees were primarily African-American pastors and related associates in the Washington, D.C. area, all of whom wanted to activate their congregations.

Clifton Mitchell, President Bush’s Coordinator of Faith and Community Partners Initiative, spoke about the President’s initiative to increase funding for faith-based rehab groups. He encouraged the attendees to form coalitions and write grant

proposals to the U.S. Government. Mr. Mitchell thanked Clark Carr and Narconon for helping him to do his job and urged everyone to visit Narconon Arrowhead.

Rev. Carlton N. Pressley (Senior Advisor for Religious Affairs to the D.C. Mayor), gave a rousing sermon, preaching among other things that the listeners "should be sending addicts to Narconon"

The President demonstrated the nerve assist, Cal Mag, the Drug Bomb vitamin formulation, and locational tech to about 50 attendees. This caused quite a buzz, with some signing up with the Executive Director of Narconon Eastern US for a full two-day First Step Workshop to be given later.

Mitchell told the President of Narconon International that he wanted him to speak at more of the SAMHSA (Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration) conferences around the country.

JORDAN

Then came an invitation to come to Amman, Jordan, from the director of a Jordanian children's mentoring charity who had toured the ABLE International building and found out about L. Ron Hubbard's work in social betterment technology.

After a briefing by Mr. Carr on Narconon technology, the gentleman asked the President to come to Amman, the capital of

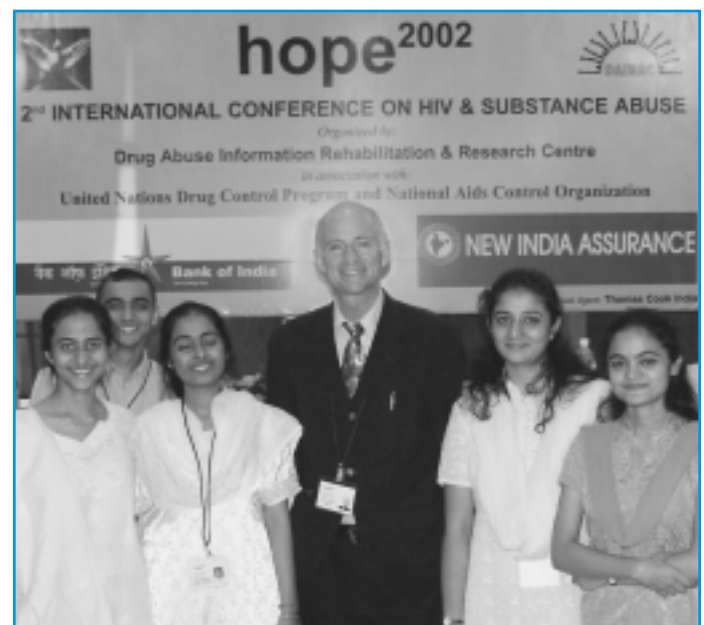
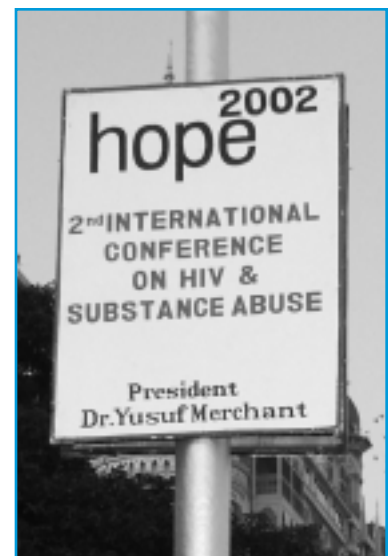
Jordan, to get briefed on Jordan's need for services and to develop a proposal to bring the Narconon drug rehabilitation technology to Jordan. There is a huge problem with drug abuse among street children in Jordan – many of whom have been abused. Providing a safe place for them where they can live and get free of drugs is a tremendous challenge for authorities. The Narconon First Step Program offers effective, intelligent technology that community members can quickly learn and use to help addicts get off drugs.

Mr. Carr met with the Director of the Anti-Narcotic Department, part of the police force. The Director runs a small "drug rehab" in their police building. After seeing a presentation on the Narconon program, the Director set up a presentation to the Senior Director of the Agency. This was very well-received and resulted in a plan for the charity director and the President of Narconon International to work with the two government directors to open a Narconon program for both adults and street children.

INDIA

The Hope 2002 Conference, in Bombay, India was an international conference on HIV and Substance Abuse treatment and prevention. This conference was organized by DAIRRC (Drug Abuse Information, Rehabilitation and Research Center), involved in the fight against Substance Abuse and AIDS since 1983, and supported by the UN Drug Control Program, UNAIDS, the Ministry of Health of India and corporate benefactors.

HIV/AIDS and drug abuse is skyrocketing in India as in much of Asia. Governments have a difficult time getting accurate statistics, but what is known has the government and the scientific field alarmed and looking for solutions.

The President of Narconon International had spoken at the earlier Hope 2000 Conference and was invited back.

This time he spoke on the Narconon First Step methodology. With the help of science associates he developed a science-based talk.

Participants from around India, Asia, and the world reached for more information on the Narconon First Step program, realizing that this simple technology can be taught, implemented, and used at the grassroots level.

While there, the President answered an invitation to present Narconon methodology to the American Consulate in Bombay. A consular official then toured him through the rehabs of Bombay, including a street children's program called "SUPPORT," feeding, housing, educating, and helping to rehabilitate addicted street kids, some as young as 6 years old. (The same problem exists in Bombay as in Jordan, children running away to live on the street rather than endure "family abuse," then using drugs or toxic substances such as glue to numb the pain of their misery and to be able to sleep on the street.)

Dr. Yusef Merchant, who spoke at the Grand Opening of Narconon Arrowhead, has committed to come to Los Angeles to learn more about L. Ron Hubbard's social betterment technology and how it can be used in communities in that part of the world.

PAKISTAN

The federal ANF (Anti Narcotics Force) of Pakistan invited the President of Narconon International back to tour and lecture throughout Pakistan. (The President had been there earlier in the year.)

Dr. Humaira Aziz, a Narconon supporter in Islamabad, has been disseminating Mr. Hubbard's social betterment technology, and Narconon drug prevention and rehabilitation methods were what were most urgently requested.

Heroin addiction in Pakistan is horrendous, "the worst in the world," says Carr, "with extremely pure Afghan heroin being pushed on Pakistani youths." The government is desperate for effective solutions. Nothing else is working at all.

Narconon International sent two people in answer to this call and arrived in Pakistan armed with First Step manuals and loads of withdrawal vitamins, ready to instruct rooms full of professionals on the Narconon First Step Workshops.

The Narconon International President first met with Dr. Muhammad Sharif, ED Narconon Hyderabad, near Karachi. Dr. Sharif set up meetings with the Mayor of Hyderabad and Latifabad, a neighboring town, and put on for the President a welcoming event with 40 enthusiastic supporters of Dr. Sharif's activities, followed by a banquet at which awards and recognitions were given out to all.

There followed a succession of lectures at medical colleges, schools, etc., around Hyderabad on Narconon

First Step and drug education.

The President and Dr. Sharif then flew to the capital, Islamabad, to meet with Dr. Humaira Aziz and the federal directors of the ANF.

A two-day workshop in the city of Rawalpindi got rave reviews. The ANF Commander, the Coordinator of NGOs in the area, and the President of the Drug Abuse Control Board did the closing ceremonies. All attendees gave heartfelt wins and thanks to Narconon International for coming to Islamabad/Rawalpindi, to the President, and to Dr. Humaira Aziz. It was a smashing success, with those attending saying they had never attended a workshop like this.

Every rehab group in attendance rushed the President for Narconon license applications. The President then toured local rehabs, giving assists to those he saw were ill, and continued to work with their representatives on how to get vitamins, etc., for delivery.

Narconon International continued with two-day workshops in Peshawar (on the Afghan border) and in Lahore (on the Indian border). Certificates of Narconon First Step Workshop attendance were given out to almost 150 attendees, many applying for Narconon licenses. This represents a grassroots movement toward handling one of the most seriously drug-afflicted areas of the world.

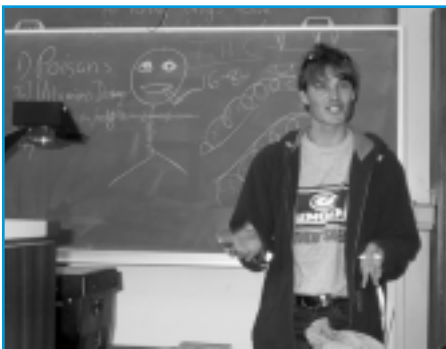
WISCONSIN

SYDNEY

The ED, Belinda Starr, is activating her field to either join staff or do field representative work. The team is composed of 12 staff members. They served an average of 17 students on the program at any given time. They also had 419 major completions for the whole year.

ARROWHEAD

Narconon Arrowhead celebrated their first anniversary. 150 staff members deliver rehabilitation services to over 160 students weekly – the largest Narconon center in the world. The number of graduates last year was 382, which is more than one a day!

FLORIDA

Narconon Florida received its state license from the Department of Children and Families (DCF). Narconon Florida was validated at 99.15% for operating procedures and facility standards. This is a huge win after a long administrative process. Delivery of out-patient services is a great asset to their community.

GEORGIA

Narconon of Georgia has increased their production and delivery to approximately 30 students on the full Narconon program. They are delivering the residential program at the farm (the Narconon facility is located on the same property as a working farm) with an outpatient office in Atlanta.

CONFRONTING

by L. Ron Hubbard

That which a person can confront, he can handle.

The first step of handling anything is gaining an ability to face it.

It could be said that war continues as a threat to man because man cannot confront war. The idea of making war so terrible that no one will be able to fight it is the exact reverse of fact – if one wishes to end war. The invention of the longbow, gun-powder, heavy naval cannon, machine guns, liquid fire¹ and the hydrogen bomb add only more and more certainty that war *will* continue. As each new element which man cannot confront is added to elements he has not been able to confront so far, man engages himself upon a decreasing ability to handle war.

We are looking here at the basic



anatomy of all problems. Problems start with an inability to confront anything. Whether we apply this to domestic quarrels or to insects, to garbage dumps or Picasso,² one can always trace the beginning of any existing problem to an unwillingness to confront.

Let us take a domestic scene.

The husband or the wife cannot confront the other, cannot confront second dynamic³ consequences, cannot confront the economic burdens, and so we have domestic strife.⁴ The less any of these actually are confronted, the more problem they will become.

It is a truism that one never solves anything by away from it. Of course, one might also say that one never solves cannonballs by baring his breast to them. But I assure you that if nobody cared whether cannonballs were fired or not, control of people by threat of cannonballs would cease.
